The **NADF "Mikinaak" Bursary** symbolizes support for Indigenous students as they progress toward their own versions of success, grounded in tradition and steady growth.

Purpose: To make a meaningful difference in the lives of Indigenous students pursuing post-secondary education.

Bursary Value: \$500 (up to \$3,000 annually)

- **Eligibility Criteria**

- Applicants must be a member of a First Nation in the Nishnawbe Aski Nation, Treaty 3, or Robinson-Superior 1850 Treaty territories.
- Applicants must be enrolled in a recognized post-secondary program, either in person or virtually.
- Preference is given to students in Business, Finance, and Administration programs.

- Selection Period: May - June

- Notification of Recipients: July - August
- Bursary Disbursement: September 1
